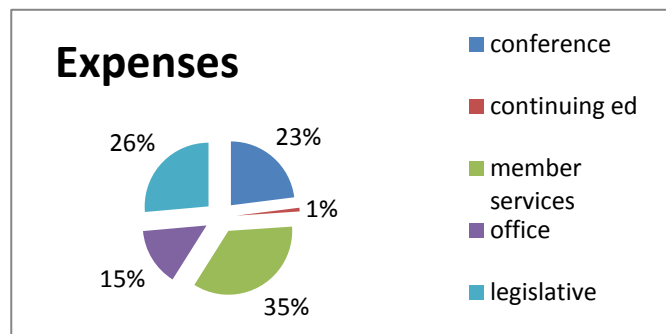
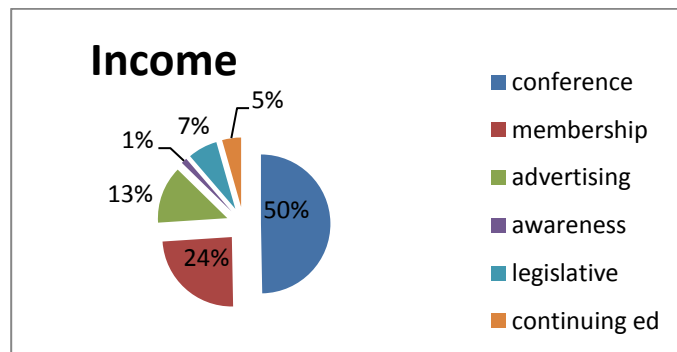
Financial Overview

In 2008-2009, IOTA

- Raised almost \$8,000 to fund legislative and awareness activities.
- Met our membership recruitment goal. Fifty percent of licensed occupational therapy practitioners are now members of IOTA.
- Successfully advocated for the adoption of the revised Idaho Occupational Therapy Practice Act.
- Facilitated active involvement from members and non members in the development of the Practice Act statute.
- Expanded the Fair Share Support initiative and generated additional funds through successful raffles and even a garage sale.
- Began recognizing practitioners for outstanding achievement above and beyond their regular duties with the Over the Top award.
- Launched the successful Treatment Summit education series.

- Advocate for the adoption of the new Rules Governing Occupational Therapy in Idaho.
